There were 3 survivors who attended the event, one of them was, Mr Sumiteru. He was a first generation survivor. His experience was absolutely petrifying and extremely shocking. On the day the bomb was dropped, he was on his bicycle delivering letters as he is a postman. All of a sudden, there was a blast that threw Mr. Sumiteru off his bicycle and he lay on the floor. He was unconscious for 3 days lying on the road before rescue workers found him and took him to the hospital. In the hospital, doctors said that he would not live but he defied them and is strong enough to live to



this day.

Secondly, was Mrs. Fumie Kakita. She is a second generation survivor and she is the Deputy Secretary General of Nagasaki Atomic bomb Survivors.

Lastly was a Malaysian survivor, YBhg Professor Tan Sri Dato' Dzulkifli Abdul Razak. He is a second generation Nagasaki bombing survivor. He is currently the 14th President of the International Association of Universities.

There were also students who came down from Japan to give speeches and ideas on how to help end wars. Before the event ended, high tea was provided to the students.

In the end, the students had the opportunity to get involved in International Level Symposiums.
